# **Registration Policies and Procedures**

Students are required to arrange a meeting with their Advisor prior to the last month of the semester to plan course registration for the following semester. The student and the Advisor can prepare for the meeting by completing the course checklist relevant to the student's program of study. The student is invited to seek the Advisor's understanding and counsel with regard to any difficulties that may have arisen in their course of study so far. Should any such difficulties persist without resolution, the student and the Advisor should inform the Coordinator of Advisement.

A completed registration packet includes the following:

- 1. The advisement form (and SGS form if beginning or changing) signed by advisor and student
- 2. A confirmation of analysis form (due annually with fall registration)
- 3. Payment in full via Empower, or
- 4. An approved payment plan through BGSP's financial advisor, details provided further in the packet


Incomplete registrations will not be accepted by the registrar.

### Late fees:

For continuing students, registration is considered late if is submitted after the indicated date on the semester registration form.

The late fee is \$150.

New students are invited to register up to the first week of classes. There is no late fee for a new student in their first semester. The following semester, policies for continuing students will apply. New students are assigned an advisor at the time of their course registration. New students should be advised that beginning an analysis with an approved modern psychoanalyst should begin by the 2nd semester of enrollment.

# **Spring 2025 Course Descriptions**

# **GPSA104** Multicultural Issues in Mental Health Work (3 Credits)

This course is designed to introduce students to theoretical models of diversity and identity development. Students will examine theories of Race, Ethnicity, Class, Sex, Gender, Sexual Orientation and Ability, and other components of cultural identities as a means of understanding the development and utility of one's own belief system, as well as the beliefs, values, and experiences of a diverse client base. This course will address the notion of 'difference' within the therapeutic hour and examine the role and influence of systemic factors within the counseling process.

# **GPSA181 Psychopathology: Severe Emotional Disorders (3 Credits)**

This course examines psychopathology of severe emotional disorders from the perspective of both the DSM, psychoanalytic theory and biography. Literature and clinical material will provide a view from the diagnostician and those who are impacted by the diagnosis. The DSM will be paired with first-hand accounts and psychodynamic understandings of symptoms clusters. The class will examine implications for treatment. Basic diagnostic skills will be applied to case material.

# **GPSA507** Human Development: Thru the Lifespan from Birth to Death (3 Credits)

This survey course will focus on the intra-psychic, developmental, and biopsychosocial processes that occur through the life span and within intrapsychic, biological, family, environmental and cultural context. How the individual approaches developmental tasks or copes with challenges of inner and outer reality, from conception through old age, is reflected in his/her sense of self and is manifested in behavior and life choices. The maturational tasks of adapting and coping that enable growth over the lifespan are examined.

### **GPSA521** Psychoanalytic Counseling: Basic Concepts (3 Credits)

This course will introduce the student to basic concepts of psychoanalytic counseling. It will be an introduction to Freudian and modern interventions within counseling and psychoanalytic frameworks. The student will learn about the basic concepts and their applications.

### **GPSA522** Comparative Psychotherapies I: Modern Concepts & Techniques (3 Credits)

In this course, students will learn the basic intervention strategies applied in counseling and psychoanalysis. We will study how these fields have expanded, in technique and theory, to include more severe emotional disorders. It will be an introduction to theory and interventions; students will learn how to apply these concepts in class via experiential learning.

### **GPSA529** Transference and Countertransference (3 Credits)

In this course students learn about the theoretical and clinical meanings of transference and countertransference and their importance as a framework and tools in working effectively with people. They study, through ongoing cases, readings, films, and group discussion, the helping relationship, and techniques to facilitate understanding of transference and countertransference as they influence self-care and self-development.

# **Spring 2025 Course Descriptions Continued**

### GPSA562B Neuropsychoanalysis II: Emotional Disorders and Our Resilient Mind (3 Credits)

By the time we are five we can look in a mirror and know, "That's me." But who exactly is me, and what neurological, biochemical, constitutional, emotional or environmentally induced reactions shape the way this budding identity faces developmental challenges and crises ahead? Neuropsychoanalysis II examines the relationship between our evolving neurobiological brain and emerging mind's adaptive or maladaptive responses in establishing a self. We explore how they result in either specific psychopathology, inability to thrive independently, or the basis for emotional resilience. We will study symptoms, behaviors, causes, prognoses, categorization, and treatment strategies for major disorders. Class material includes readings, videos, case presentations, guest lecturers, and lively group discussions. You need not be a neuroscientist or seasoned clinician to jump into this exciting exploration of paths to emotional disorders or resilience. Just bring a mind to be curious, stretch perspectives, and share ideas. \*Fulfills either Elective or Theory requirements

### **GPSA586** Career Counseling (3 Credits)

This course is designed to provide and understanding of career development and the interrelationship between careers and personality' lifespan development; family; lifestyle choice; use of defense mechanisms and diversity. A broad understanding of career development theories, occupational and educational information sources, assessment tools, and measures, decision-making models and Online resources will be reviewed. Students' assignments will be based on self- assessment modules in which the student will apply concepts, tools and theory to the student's own life experience.

# GPSA700 Fieldwork Practicum Seminar & Supervised Group Studies (SGS) (4 Credits)

In this first segment of the fieldwork experience, students are supported to apply skills and develop self-awareness through clinical experiences while interfacing with the fieldwork coordinator, mentor, clinical supervisor, academic advisor. Students are guided in a clinical site to initiate therapeutic relationship and apply basic techniques to facilitate understanding of transference while the student observes themselves through describing countertransferencial experiences. Ethical approaches to practice are emphasized.

# GPSA701 Fieldwork Internship Seminar – When and How to Intervene: Transference and Countertransference & Supervised Group Studies (SGS) (4 Credits)

In this segment of the fieldwork experience, students study the helping relationship and techniques to facilitate understanding of transference and countertransference as they influence the student's self-development. Students learn how to recognize signs and symptoms of psychopathology and how to identify process and understand his or her feelings while exploring possible inductions from cases. Ethical approaches to practice are emphasized.

# **GPSA755 Clinical Case Seminar: Clinical Practice (3 Credits)**

This course is designed for students who are clinical candidates. Each week a clinical practice issue or dilemma is presented. Students review models for understanding the topic in a counseling and psychoanalytic framework. Special consideration is given to ethical practice. The course prepares students to work at an advanced level with complex treatment situations. Special emphasis is placed on the students' clinical experiences, resistance, transference, and countertransference reactions in relation to the course content.

# **Spring 2025 Course Descriptions Continued**


# **GPSA758** Continuing Case Seminar (3 Credits)

Through continuing case presentations of three cases, students will apply theory to practice. With the agreement of the training committee, this course can be selected as fulfilling the requirement for the clinical case course after four semesters of successful completion of clinical case coursework.

### **GPSA810** The Psychoanalytic View of Women (3 Credits)

This course examines the evolving views of women's psychic development and roles in society from both psychoanalytic and sociological perspectives. The work of Freud, Deutsch, Horney, Bonaparte, Klein, Jacobson, Thompson, Chodorow, Gilligan, and others will be considered.

#### Dear Students,

Welcome to the Spring 2025 semester! Please log in to the EMPOWER student information system to register for courses. Please see instructions below on how to register for your classes.

- 1. Click this link to log in to EMPOWER <a href="https://bgsp.empower-xl.com/fusebox.cfm">https://bgsp.empower-xl.com/fusebox.cfm</a> It can also be found at the top right corner on the NJ.BGSP.edu website.
- 2. Bring your cursor to the word "Students" in the red bar at the top and click on "Empower".
- 3. Once you login, click the "Student Records" Tab then look under the sub-heading "Course Tools", and click "Course Registration".
- 4. The screen will show that you have No Enrollments and No Pending Registration. Click the "Add Courses" Button located above "Dept"
- 5. The next screen will give you a series of filter options. Select NJBGSP as the campus and Click Search
- 6. On the next screen you will see the courses being offered in the Summer 2024 semester. The Detail button to the right of each course will give the course description.
- 7. To elect courses, Click the little box to the left of the courses. Then, click the Register button found at the top or bottom of the course list.
  - a. IMPORTANT: After you click the Register button, you will come to a screen that says "0 Successful Registrations" and "X Pending registrations". All courses will automatically be entered as "Pending"
  - b. To complete the registration process, you will need to contact your advisor to let them know you have made your course elections. Your advisor/fellow will then view your elections in Empower and complete the registration if they approve.
- 8. To see your tuition and fees charges for the term and make payment online:
  - a. Click on the "Financials" Tab at the top of the page, then, under the "Student Billing" heading, choose "Estimated Tuition Worksheet". This report will tell you what the estimated term charges will be based on the course selections you made.
  - b. If you wish to make a payment online, you may do so from this screen
    - i. Click on the dropdown box next to "Payment Type" to select either Credit Card or Electronic Check. A Non-refundable convenience fee up to 3.15% on the total transaction will be assessed by your credit/debit card company for credit/debit card payments.
    - ii. Click the "Submit" button at the bottom of the screen and then follow the prompts to complete your online payment.

If you are a Mental Health Counseling student interested in applying for the *Career Advancement Scholarship*, please either contact me or the Registrar for a copy of the application. If you are interested in borrowing Federal Student Loans through the William D. Ford Direct Loan program to help finance your studies, application directions are included below.

### **How to Apply**

The first step is to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online using your Federal Student Aid ID number. The FSA ID serves as your electronic signature when completing the FAFSA. If you don't already have one, apply for an FSA ID online at <a href="https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch">https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch</a>. Then, complete your **2024-2025** application online at <a href="https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa">https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa</a> [Note: this is likely <a href="not your most recent tax return">not your most recent tax return</a>, but the prior year return].

The FAFSA school code for ICPS is G31943, with the state listed as Massachusetts, and the city listed as Brookline.

You are also required to complete Entrance Counseling at <a href="https://studentaid.gov/h/complete-aid-process">https://studentaid.gov/h/complete-aid-process</a>. From the landing page you can click in the entrance counseling section to sign in using your FSA ID. Read through the instructions, and then choose to complete your entrance counseling as a graduate student. When prompted, select *Massachusetts* as the state and *Boston Graduate School of Psychoanalysis* as your school. The session takes about 30 minutes.

Finally, you will need to sign a Master Promissory Note (MPN), if you do not already have one on file. To e-sign the MPN, visit <a href="https://studentaid.gov/h/complete-aid-process">https://studentaid.gov/h/complete-aid-process</a> and select the option to sign a loan agreement. Depending on the loans you plan to borrow for the 2024-25 academic year, you will need to sign the Subsidized/ Unsubsidized Stafford MPN, the PLUS MPN, or both. When prompted, choose <code>Massachusetts</code> as the state, <code>Brookline</code> as the city, and <code>Boston Graduate School of Psychoanalysis</code> as your school. If you prefer a paper copy, please contact me.

The Career Advancement Scholarship is available to selected graduate students entering the M.A. in Mental Health Counseling program or the One Year Program. Applicants who have worked at the Bachelor's level in a clinical human service agency in the U.S. (such as a hospital, residential facility, or in-home intervention program) for at least one year at the time of first application to BGSP may apply. The scholarship offers up to 20% of course tuition, renewable each semester, as long as the student maintains good academic standing. Open to students at the Boston and New Jersey campuses.

A limited number of Career Advancement Scholarships are available each year. Interested applicants must apply by December 15th for consideration in a Spring semester, and by July 15th for a Fall semester.

**Note:** for Mental Health Counseling students, this scholarship applies to the first 60 unique academic credits. For One Year Program students, this scholarship applies to the first 2 unique semesters. Retaken coursework is not eligible.
